MACDONALD STREET PAVING PROJECT UPDATE

The Macdonald Street paving project in Belfast has been successfully completed, showcasing the Emakhazeni Local Municipality's commitment to infrastructure development. This R29 million project, awarded to Mahlangu Mgabadeli under the directorship of Mr. Vusi Mahlangu (also known as Vus Bereza) by Nkangala District Municipality, has paved 2,500 meters of the street.

Project Completion.

The project has reached 100% completion and has achieved its objectives.

- Job Creation: A total of 34 employment opportunities were created, contributing to the local economy and benefiting the community.

- Subcontractor Development: Six subcontractors, initially graded as Grade 1, have been elevated to Grade 3 due to their involvement in this project, demonstrating the initiative's impact on local business growth and capacity building.

SAKHELWE STADIUM DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The Sakhelwe Stadium project, valued at R 10 million and a multi-year project, is a significant development aimed at providing world-class sports facilities to the community. Here's an update on the project:

- Project Value: R 10 million
- Progress: The project is currently at 75% completion.
- Facilities: The stadium will feature soccer, netball and tennis facilities, promoting sports development and community engagement.

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RETURN OF SUSPENDED MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES IN ENTOKOZWENI

In a significant step for workers' rights, the South African Municipal Workers' Union (SAMWU) in eMakhazeni Local Municipality has successfully negotiated the return of suspended municipal employees in Entokozweni.

Eleven (11) employees were suspended on full pay in March 2020 for engaging in an unprotected strike whereby municipal property was damaged. These employees were subjected to a disciplinary hearing whereby a guilty verdict was pronounced and given a sanction of a final written warning.

Because of the serious nature of the charges, Council took the matter for review at the labour court demanding dismissal. However lengthy delays to have the matter dealt with by the court were experienced of which one of the contributing factors was the Covid 19 pandemic which negatively affected the normal operations of the courts.

The delay of finalizing the matter by the court had a severe impact on service delivery, future of these employees and staff shortages. Therefore intense negotiations were started by council and the labour unions which culminated to the return of these employees back to work in March 2025.

Both council and labour appreciate their return to work and this has improved service delivery and relations between the two parties.







DUGGAN STREET PAVING

The Duggan Street paving project is currently underway, with 500 meters of the street being paved. This initiative has already made a positive impact on the community, creating 26 job opportunities for local residents.

Project Progress:

- Progress: The project is currently at 25% completion.
- Job Creation: 26 jobs have been created, contributing to the local economy and benefiting the community.





MONGWE RING ROAD PHASE 2 PAVING OF STREET IN SIYATHUTHUKA Extension 3 Project Completion Update

We are pleased to report on the successful completion of the Mongwe Ring Road Phase 2 project, which involved the paving of streets in Siyathuthuka Extension 3. Although the project took longer than it was initially planned it has however been finalized.

- Project Value: R 2,307,570
- **Project Duration:** Initially planned for 7 months (July 2024 to January 2025), but took a bit longer to complete.
- Employment Creation: The project created 8 job opportunities for local residents.
- Subcontractor Development: 3 subcontractors were utilized, contributing to local economic growth and development.
